Problem: There have been no existing direct records found stating the parents of Cornelius

B. Garrison.

The parents of Cornelius B. Garrison are James Garretson, born 06 Dec 1803 in Clarkstown, Rockland, New York, USA and Margaret M. Bogert, born 17 Sep 1800 in Blauvelt, Rockland, New York, USA.



Detailed Findings:

1. In the 1870 Federal Census Record, Cornelius B. Garrison was the head of household in Clarkstown, Rockland County, New York, and Rachel E. Garrison was listed as his wife.

Document Conclusion: Included in the household we find a Margaret Baker living there around an estimated age to be the mother of either the head of household or his wife. Estimated date of birth for Margaret M. Baker is 1803.



Document Conclusion: This New York State Census, under column 12, asks about the number of times Margaret Baker has been married, and she answers two. Then, under column 14, she is marked as a widow. This provides further documentation leaning towards proving the theory of this being Cornelius B. Garrison's mother and that the Baker name is from a second marriage.



5. A Margaret Bogert, married to a William Baker, was discovered in the Synder Cemetery in Valley Cottage, Rockland County, New York.







Document Conclusion: This document is a primary source confirming all other documents and solidifying Margaret (Bogert) Baker's relationship as the mother of Cornelius B. Garrison and Sarah Catherine Garrison. Thus, it confirms the legitimacy of the discovery that Margaret's maiden name is Bogert and that she had a first marriage to James Garrison, who is the father of both Cornelius B. Garrison and his sister Sarah Catherine (Garrison) Hartwick.
